

Write a Pi Poem (Piem) or Story

A pi poem is a good way to explore the digits of π . It's made of words where the length of each word is equal to each digit of pi. So your poem or story should start with a 3-letter word, then a 1-letter word, then a 4-letter word and so on.

Try writing a poem or story using the digits in pi to 20 decimal places. Write each word in the table below.

$$\Pi = 3.14159265358979323846$$

Top Tip: Punctuation doesn't count so you can add a comma, apostrophe or dash if it helps!
